Colorectal Cancer Screening Proactive Tracking and Protection

The government subsidizes free quantitative immunoassay fecal occult blood testing biennially for people aged 45 to 74, and for those aged 40 to 44 with a family history. Eligible people are advised to receive regular screening, and if the screening is abnormal (positive), you should go to the hospital as soon as possible for a colonoscopy.

*If screened positive, colorectal polyps will be found in 1 out of 2 people, and colorectal cancer will be found in 1 out of 20 people.
*If screened positive without a colonoscopy, the mortality rate increases by 64%.
